

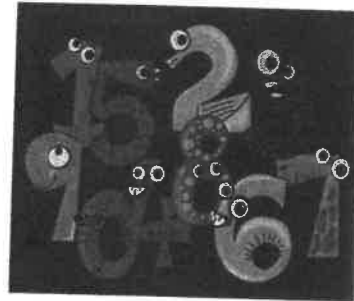

- Return to classroom teacher by Friday August 31st, 2018






















For those who return their sheet there will be a pizza party provided at the beginning of the school year.
